5. DESCRIPTION	The Aviation English Language Course is designed to provide knowledge and language expertise to ATCs and pilots to prepare them for ICAO level 4 operational standard exam. The course is suitable for both experienced and novice ATCOs and pilots who need to expand their base of technical English. The syllabus is based on ICAO recommendations and holistic descriptors included in document 9835 and cover all the essential ICAO recommended lexical areas: Health, Technical Problems, Ground Operations, Weather, Fire and Smoke, Security etc. Special emphasis is put on speaking and listening skills.
6. AIM	 Aviation English training program is designed to meet the English language needs of aviation professionals: – pilots and air-traffic controllers who wish to achieve an ICAO 'Operational Level 4' in English. The course aims at improving their general ability to communicate on work-related matters, particularly in non-routine and/or in-flight emergency situations. It must be stressed that Aviation English course is by no means intended to provide the knowledge of standard phraseology but, what ICAO emphasizes, improve students' plain English that will allow clear communication between pilots and air-traffic controllers in a wide range of unexpected situations. This is especially important as effective verbal communication.
